FROM THE DESK OF SUPERINTENDENT JOHN DENNEY...

With another summer coming quickly to a close, we are preparing for another great year! We are excited to have the hallways full of students and staff bringing the buildings back to life. Thanks to our great maintenance and custodial staff, our buildings and grounds are in phenomenal condition and ready for another school year.

I want to thank our wonderful community for recently supporting our bond initiative; we will put the new resources to very good use. Our phone system has been replaced and we are working to finalize plans for upgrading our security cameras and the PA system at the HS/MS complex. Once those major projects are finished, our Technology Committee will work together in order to identify the most effective way to spend the remaining funds.

This is a good time to update you on some other key areas within the district. I want to focus on two main things: School Board Goals and our latest sinking fund projects.

School Board Goals: Several years ago, the Hanover-Horton Board of Education adopted a set of goals to guide the direction of the district. They held a series of meetings in order to gather input from a wide range of stakeholders; our board is asking for your help to work through this process again. Their hope is to listen and discuss the current goals and determine what changes are needed in order to keep moving our district forward in a positive direction.

Their first meeting to hold these discussions will be held on Monday, October 2nd. The meeting will begin with some food at 6:00 p.m. and end promptly at 8:00 p.m. They will meet in the HS/MS Library and will be able to use the space to hold several small group discussions. Anybody that wants to participate in this process is encouraged and welcome to participate. More details about this process will be shared once they are finalized.

Sinking Fund Projects: Unlike many of our recent summers, this year's sinking fund projects will not be as noticeable as

those driving by our buildings; much of the focus was on items you simply do not see, but definitely need to be addressed. One major project dealt with our main power supply to the HS/MS complex and the athletic complex. We replaced the original supply lines and transformers which had exceeded their expected lifespan. The entire project was broken up into four parts; two were completed when we built the weight room. This summer's work finished the upgrades for the complex.

Another project which will be ongoing throughout the school year will be the change from fluorescent lighting to LED lighting throughout our buildings, with the exception of our gyms. We will be able to take advantage of Consumers Energy grants to help offset the costs of this project. The new lighting is much cheaper to use and also provides better lighting.

The most noticeable project is the new entryway at the middle school. This new space will provide a sheltered area for students to be either at the beginning of the day or after school. We wanted to make sure that our middle school students had a safe and comfortable place to be while they were waiting. The project is ongoing, but we are hopeful that it will be completed prior to their open house on August 21st.


Healthy Changes in Our School Cafeterias

Hanover-Horton School cafeterias are meeting tough new federal nutrition standards for school meals, ensuring that meals are healthy and well-balanced and provide students all the nutrition they need to succeed at school. Now is a great time to encourage your kids to choose school lunch!

School meals offer students milk, fruits and vegetables, proteins and grains, and they must meet strict limits on saturated fat and portion size. School lunches will meet additional standards requiring:

- Age-appropriate calorie limits
- Larger servings of vegetables and fruits (students must take at least one serving of produce)
- A wider variety of vegetables, including dark green and red/orange vegetables and legumes
- Fat-free or 1% milk (flavored milk must be fat-free)
- More whole grains
- And less sodium



We're always working to offer Hanover-Horton School students healthier and tastier choices. We are focusing on serving healthy homemade entrees, locally grown foods and increased offerings of whole grains.
