The Hanover-Horton School District is a small town atmosphere, yet with the proximity of the district to the I-94 corridor gives the residents of the community easy access to the cultural, educational, and recreational activities in Jackson, Lansing, Battle Creek, Kalamazoo, and Ann Arbor.

Just over 1200 students are served in the district by a staff of 65 teachers. Elementary students in grades kindergarten through five are located at the elementary school in the village of Hanover. The district's secondary complex located midway between the villages of Hanover and Horton contains grades six through twelve. Construction was completed on a new library at the secondary complex in January of 2006.

As a district, we currently have over 30% of our students enrolled through the school of choice program. With declining population, enrollment has also declined over the past few years.
