# FROM THE DESK OF SUPERINTENDENT LINDA BRIAN...

This past June we celebrated the commencement of 86 seniors in the Class of 2011. It was one of our smaller classes, but these students were as academically and athletically focused as any group we have seen walk across the stage. This class qualified for over \$1.4 million in scholarships. No other high school in the area has the number of fully endowed scholarships that we are able to offer our students because of the type of community support that we have received over the years. Twenty-five of our students wore the blue sash that signified that they are part of the National Honor Society. That meant that they met the requirements for knowledge, scholarship, service and leadership. Thirty-four of our graduates wore gold honor cords signifying that they had a grade point average (GPA) of 3.5 or better and

17 additional students wore silver cords indicating that they had earned a GPA of 3.0-3.49. We had one salutatorian and 6 valedictorians share with us their special thoughts and memories of their 13 years with us during their graduation speeches. Another unique aspect of this class is the athletic talent that these young men and women had with over 15% of our Class of 2011 signing letters of intent to play athletics at the collegiate level. That really says a lot about the dedication and work ethic that our students have shown. Thanks to all of our teachers, coaches and parents for your hard work in getting this group of students ready for life beyond high school.

We are eagerly awaiting the return of our teachers and stu-Our buildings dents. have been prepped and cleaned in anticipation of the start of another school year. We know that this is going to be another great school year. I couldn't be prouder of the success that we see on the part of our students. Letter from Kathie Michel

School Board President

We are fortunate to live in a community that values education. But these are challenging times for school districts across Michigan and the nation. For several years now, we have made serious budget cuts in order to balance our budget. These cuts have been across every department and impacted every area of our school district. We have reduced administrative staff, teachers, aides, counselors, secretaries, bus drivers and custodians. We have been learning how to do more with less. We have instituted energy reduction plans, cut back on supplies and equipment, trimmed back our athletic offerings and delayed textbook adoptions. We also have been active in county-wide collaborations and consolidations of services to save the district money.

From the superintendent down, we have all shared in the impact of the state budget cuts. Our superintendent has refused salary increases since 2008. All of our administrative staff have changed their insurance from MESSA to a less costly, high deductible plan and now pay significant premium contributions. We have received concessions from our support staff. And our teachers have also chosen to forgo salary increases and will be paying premium contributions in both the form of increased deductibles and more out of pocket expenditures.

These sacrifices are well known and greatly appreciated by our school board, but less widely known by our community members. Please join with our school board in letting all of the individuals in our district know that you recognize and appreciate not only what they have done to help our district be financially stable, but what they do day in and day out to help our children become successful adults. I am fortunate to have three successful graduates from Hanover-Horton and all three have graduated from college. One is gainfully employed in her career area, one accepted to med school and one in a doctoral program for physical therapy. Our school district did a great job in preparing them for life be




