## FROM THE DESK OF SUPERINTENDENT LINDA BRIAN

Even though it doesn't feel like fall, we know that it is just around the corner. With the hot and dry summer that we have had, many of us are looking forward to cooler temperatures and the first signs of fall.
Before we move on to the 2012-2013 school year, we need to pause and recognize our graduates of the Class of 2012. This past June, 103 of our seniors walked across the stage to receive their diplomas. This remarkable class of students earned an incredible $\$ 1,150,000$ in awards, recognition and scholarships!
We are fortunate to live in a community that works so hard to provide scholarship opportunities to our students. This year we had one new local scholarship that was awarded senior honors night, in addition to approximately 35 additional local scholarships awarded to our students. Seventeen of our students qualified for the Legacy Scholarship and 26 of our students qualified for the Ruth Creps Scholarship. With college expenses at an all-time high we know that these awards are greatly valued by our students and their families. Twenty of our students wore the blue sash that
signified that they were part of the National Honor Society. That means that they met the requirement for knowledge, scholarship, service and leadership. 36 of our students wore gold honor cords signifying that they had a GPA of 3.5 or better. Twenty-two of our students had silver cords indicating that they have earned a GPA of 3.0-3.49.
A large percentage of our talented students are continuing their education at Michigan State University, University of Michigan, University of Toledo, Western Michigan University, Eastern Michigan University, Adrian College, Kendall College of Art and Design, Kettering University, Spring Arbor University, Saginaw Valley University, Jackson Community College, Baker College, Lewis and Clark Community College, Kalamazoo Valley Community College, Lansing Community College and Hobart Institute of Welding Technology. And we are honored to have our graduates joining the armed forces, including the Air Force, Marine Corp, and the Army.
This kind of success comes because the families

## REQUEST FORM TO KEEP YOUR CONTACT INFORMATION PRIVATE

The law requires that schools give parents and students the opportunity to request that information, including name, phone number, address, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received and the most recent previous educational agency of institution attended by the student, not be disclosed to anyone outside of the school.

If you don't want your information released to military recruiters and/or request that your information be kept private in other places, as well (such as a yearbook or other school publication) please fill out the form below.

Once a parent or student makes this request, directory information cannot be disclosed without the affirmative consent of the parent (or the student if the student is over 18 years of age). If you do not opt out a school may provide only the student's name, address and listed phone number to military recruiters, upon request. Unlisted phone numbers may not be disclosed.

These requests are separated in the form below so that it is clear what information you wish to be released and to whom it may be released. Once you have signed and returned the form the information may not be released without a parent or guardian's prior written consent.

It is not required by law but it is recommended that a parent or guardian and the student both sign this form. It is also recommended that you keep a copy for your records.

## Healthy Changes in Our School Cafeterias!

This fall, Hanover-Horton School District cafeterias are meeting tough new federal nutrition standards for school meals, ensuring that meals are healthy and well-balanced and provide students all the nutrition they need to succeed at school. Now is a great time to encourage your kids to choose school lunch!

School meals offer students milk, fruits and vegetables, proteins and grains, and they must meet strict limits on saturated fat and portion size. Starting in School Year 2012-2013, school lunches will meet additional standards requiring: age-appropriate calorie limits, larger servings of vegetables and fruits (students must take at least one serving of produce), a wider variety of vegetables, including dark green and red/orange vegetables and legumes, fat-free or $1 \%$ milk (flavored milk must be fat-free), more whole grains, and less sodium.

We're always working to offer Hanover-Horton students healthier and tastier choices. We are focusing on serving healthy homemade entrees, locally grown foods and increased offerings of whole grains. School meals are a great value and a huge convenience for busy families too! Below are the meal prices.

Meal applications can be submitted prior to the beginning of school by stopping by any of the building offices or submitting an application online at LunchApp.com. Applications can take up to 10 days for processing. For fastest approval utilize our online portal at www.LunchApp.com.
