This fall, our Boys' Cross Country team won the Division III State Championship. The championship was the first for our boys, third for the cross country program, and the tenth overall for our school district. Our program is consistently among the most successful programs in our area and represent our community well everywhere we go. We are also extremely proud to have several teams and individuals recognized as Academic All-State; not only do our Comets excel in competition, they are also performing in the classroom.

Our district is proud to be joining with the other traditional public school districts throughout Jackson County in providing a great new opportunity to the students of our county. Starting in the fall of 2018, the Jackson County Early College (JCEC) will start operation. Other schools and counties have started middle college programs, but the JCEC will be unique in many ways and truly groundbreaking in how it will operate. Students will be able to earn their Associate's Degree with little cost to them or their families through this program.



They will also have the option to earn college credit while still being a part of our district. Unlike similar programs around, students in the JCEC will still be able to participate in all of the extra-curricular options that are offered at their high school.

We have already held meetings for our current seniors and their parents, with other meetings planned to explain the benefits of this program. More information on this program is included in this newsletter and much more will follow. Feel free to contact us if you have any questions.

JACKSON COUNTY EARLY COLLEGE

Education is more important than ever. To give students a jump start on a college education while saving money for families, Jackson County's public school districts, along with the Jackson County Intermediate School District and Jackson College, have come together to create the new Jackson County Early College (JCEC).

What is an early college?

Early colleges allow students to earn both a high school diploma and an associate degree by completing a 13th year, all at a fraction of the cost!

When can students enroll in early college? College courses can begin in grade 9, but students will usually begin in grade 11.

College degrees may transfer more readily to a four-year institution than individual courses and credits.

Students may participate in sports and extracurricular activities as usual at their high schools through 12th grade. Students who complete the full program (through year 13) will also be able to walk with their peers during commencement, with the official diploma conferred when they successfully exit the program.

Informational meetings for students and families in your district are coming soon, which will cover enrollment, eligibility, timelines, college pathway options, and more. Speak with your high school counselor, or contact Jean Logan, program administrator, to learn the dates of your district's meetings.

Jackson Community Foundation Grant Awarded

In August, 2017, Emily Wilburn was awarded a \$2,000 Teachers Fund Grant from the Jackson Community Foundation for her proposal, "Chromebooks for Special Education." Ms. Wilburn is a secondary special education teacher who teaches Resource Room Math at the middle school level and Resource Room English at the high school level. With the grant funds, Miss Wilburn was able to purchase 10 Chromebooks which allows for 1:1 technology use in each of her classes. The Chromebooks are used in math classes to remediate and individualize math instruction using online math resources. At the high school level, students use the Chromebooks to access and complete assignments, as well as to receive instructional support from Ms. Wilburn.
