#### FROM THE DESK OF SUPERINTENDENT JOHN DENNEY...

As we have quickly rolled into February, it is hard to believe how fast this school year is going. Despite significant challenges and difficult situations to work through, our staff and students are having another great year, and we look forward to what lies ahead for all of us.



Last spring, our Board of Education approved spending

over \$120,000 on new curriculum for our district. This fall, many of our secondary-level students began using new textbooks in both math and science classes. A new reading program was purchased for our elementary building, and our staff have started the process of implementing the new curriculum. This fall also saw our boys' cross country team win their second state championship in three years, and so far this winter, our Comets are looking to continue our run of unparalleled athletic success. It is certainly a great time to be either a Comet or a Comet fan!

Also last spring, our community was gracious enough to pass our facilities bond proposal. In order to avoid spending district money before the election, we held off on significant planning until after the community gave us their approval. Progress on the bond projects was slow moving through the summer and fall, as attention and energy was needed elsewhere. In recent weeks, the progress has really been picking up. Once we have our designs finalized and the plans approved, we will send everything out for bid. The bidding process will help us to know exactly how many projects the bond proceeds will be able to cover. Thankfully, we will have the sinking fund money available to help finish off most of our original wish list of projects. While we are not as far along as we had wished to be, we are still hopeful to be able to break ground on the projects when school lets out for the summer.

The team has produced the first three wrestlers to get their 100th career victories in Randy Frailey, Trent Hoctor, and Chris Sorrow. Also, Danni Swihart became the first girl at Hanover-Horton to earn All-State recognition in wrestling (see page 2). The girls' varsity basketball team has dealt with some injuries, but is still battling at 5-10 on the season, while the JV team is at 8-7.
