DID YOU KNOW?

More than 4,000 students ages birth to 26 years old in the Jackson County ISD service area currently receive some form of special education services.

If approved, this millage would generate approximately \$8.8 million for students with special education needs in the Jackson County ISD service area.

Special Education Millage Renewal Proposal

The May 2 ballot will have a question asking voters to renew the Jackson County Intermediate School District Special Education Millage. If approved, the funds will be used by the JCISD to reimburse local schools for their mandated special education costs.

3 Fast Facts:

- 1. NO NEW TAXES: This is a renewal of the 1.5408-mill property tax millage that voters last approved in May 2017.
- 2. 100% of FUNDS DISTRIBUTED: 100% of the revenue generated by this millage will be distributed to all of the local school districts. Jackson County ISD receives no funding from this millage.
- 3. ALL KIDS BENEFIT: Without this millage in place, local school districts would lose millions in funding for mandated special education costs, resulting in fewer dollars to support programs for all students.
